

Parliamentary Bootcamp Article

It's in the Presentation By Henry E. Bennett, Jr., Past Parliamentarian, North Central Province

In the late 1960s, the political climate of the North Central Province was aggressive, if not extreme. In most areas, undergraduates were just as skillful on the floor debates as the alumni. During that time, this columnist was privileged to serve as an undergraduate on the province's board of directors. It was a challenging administrative and parliamentary learning experience that will never be forgotten.

At one Province Council Board meeting before the general session, the Province Polemarch and the Board anticipated a problem in approving an annual budget. All costs were increasing. The cost of eggs increased to 35 cents per dozen, premium gasoline increased to 28 cents per gallon, movie theater tickets increased to one dollar, and mileage reimbursement increased to 10 cents per mile. This proposed annual budget was eight hundred dollars (\$800.00), the highest amount the Province Board had ever proposed.

Board members knew operational expenses had doubled in less than ten years, and the Province Exchequer needed increased funds to operate effectively. The Keeper of Exchequer was a brother named James "Big Jim" Thompson of the Des Moines (IA) Alumni Chapter. He said he was confident he could make his case before the Council. The Board agreed to let Big Jim handle the presentation exclusively, as no one else relished being placed in the line of fire.

The next day, during the general session, Big Jim took to the podium to present his budget. He greeted all the brothers and expressed his gratitude that so many were there. He said, "All reports of importance should be presented as an informative story with a plot, a beginning, a middle, and an end that everyone should be able to follow. I have a story that I would like to share with you concerning just that issue: The young grandson of a Senior Kappa asked his grandfather for help in his reading composition class project. The young future Kappa had written a story about Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid. One night, the two outlaws were spotted on the town's streets, casing out the local bank. When the local sheriff recognized them, they ran to their horses and galloped out of town. Most of the sheriff's deputies were at the local saloon enjoying the company of the dance hall girls. The sheriff saw a young lad walking by. He shouted, "Go tell the deputies at the jail about Butch and Sundance and which way they're headed. I'm going to the saloon to get the rest of the posse." The Senior Kappa read the story. He looked at his grandson and said, "I like your story, son. It started very exciting and kept me very interested, but you spelled the last word in your last sentence wrong....."

Brother Thompson stopped speaking. There was complete silence in the room, then there were chuckles,

and finally, there was laughter from the entire assembly (if you didn't get it, you need to simply think about where a Nupe's mind often gravitates).

From that point on, Big Jim had the Assembly at ease and attentive to discuss a raw subject presented on the floor. "I shouldn't waste any more of your valuable time because everyone is anxious to round up their own...... 'posse' after the session concludes." In advance and with his own money, Big Jim provided hard copies of the typewritten budget to all voting and non-voting delegates for review.

It was impeccably put together with 10-point type, clean columns, and explanations of each expenditure category. At the end of his presentation, Big Jim asked: "Brothers, what is your pleasure?" Immediately there was a motion from the floor to adopt the North Central Province Board's budget presented by the Keeper of the Exchequer. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved without any discussion.

Little has changed in almost 60 years since that Province Council. The outcome could have easily gone a different way if presented differently. Content, data, and documentation are only one part of the strategy of getting a report approved. Big Jim temporarily created a relaxed atmosphere to conduct business, and no deception was used, hiding, or tweaking any facts and numbers. However, this presentation was also backed up by a superior and clearly written report. (1) Remember to cultivate trust and respect from your membership by your deeds. (2) Know your body of membership. Never speak longer than the attention span of your membership. (3) Back up your presentation with facts. (4) Anticipate questions that could be asked and have answers ready. (5) Never talk down to the "Least Common Denominator" in the room. (6) Never let your levity and jokes be the subject rather than a tool of your presentation. There is never any guarantee of 100% success with these tactics, but when you learn to know your audience, your audience will learn, respect, and listen to you. If you place them at ease and gain their trust, they will listen with an attentive and supportive mind rather than an adversarial ear.


Nu Chapter returns to Purdue, releases March 2024 Newsletter

Woodlawn Community Food Pantry

The Woodlawn Community Food Pantry (WCFP) was founded in 2019 by a group of African American men who are members of the Chicago (IL) Alumni Chapter, Senior Kappa Affairs Committee at the Edward G. Irvin Foundation Achievement Center in the Woodlawn Community. They wanted to do something to address food insecurity throughout Woodlawn. A small founding group of ten brothers each donated \$200.00 as seed money for a monthly produce distribution launched in August of 2019, just before the COVID-19 Pandemic. The group leaders researched and reviewed pantry best practices and met with numerous individuals, companies, and organizations, including the Greater Chicago Food Depository (GCFD). It was determined that a partnership with GCFD would be a successful venture and very beneficial to the target communities. A collaboration was formed that has continued to strengthen and expand over the years. Today, GCFD remains a significant partner with WCFP. WCFP became a full-fledged food pantry in January of 2021, during the height of the pandemic. Since then, it has matured into a vital "go-to" source for nutritional assistance throughout Chicago's Woodlawn community and surrounding areas.

WCFP is committed to increasing food security for families, children, and senior citizens throughout its target areas. It achieves this goal through frequent distributions of a wide variety of high-quality, healthy, and delicious foods, such as fresh produce, dairy, baked goods, healthy proteins, and low-calorie, low-sodium frozen and canned foods. WCFP offers other services designed to improve the health and well-being of the community, including seminars on health issues, vaccine information and access, instructional cooking videos, and free reusable shopping bags. The WCFP continues its close working relationship with the Greater Chicago Food Depository and welcomes collaborations with other groups and organizations with similar missions. Volunteers from the Chicago (IL) Alumni Chapter of Kappa Alpha Psi, other non-profit organizations, and residents of the community staff the Woodlawn Community Food Pantry. It receives financial support from a wide array of private philanthropic and other organizations committed to increasing food security and nutrition education in Chicago. The community has welcomed WCFP, becoming an essential link in Woodlawn's food chain.

WCFP's mission is to leverage our resources and relationships to fight hunger in Woodlawn and surrounding communities in Chicago, Illinois, through collaborations with other civic, corporate, healthcare, and community organizations to expand pantry services and to address issues that affect the overall health and wellness of its programs' participants.

Professional Background


